The project will be overseen by Center for Technology and School Change Executive Director, Dr. Ellen Meier and Senior Associate Direct of Professional Learning, Karen Kirsch Page. Dr. Meier received her doctorate in Organization and Leadership from Teachers College. She began her career as a teacher and later worked with numerous state and federal innovation programs in the area of school improvement and technology, particularly in urban settings. In collaboration with the CTSC Facilitators, she has articulated a curriculum design approach to help teachers integrate technology. She has served as Co-Chair to the State of New York Technology Policy and Practices Council, formed by the Regents of the State of New York to advise the regents on policy issues related to the use of technology in achieving Regents'

goals. She is also an Associate Professor in the Department of Mathematics, Science, and Technology at Teachers College, Columbia University. Ms. Page worked as a K-8 technology and STEM teacher and instructional coach in San Francisco in a K-8 school where she designed a STEM and Digital Arts electives sequence. In addition to leading the professional development team at CTSC, Ms. Page has provided instructional and curricular design support for K-12 teachers both in the U.S. and Africa where she co-founded a free annual education technology conference for underserved teachers now going into its eighth year. Ms. Page is passionate about helping schools and organizations around the world create a culture receptive to implementing technology for creative teaching and learning.

Jackie Pilati and Kim Van Wyck, both Professional Development Associates at CTSC, will work directly in the school with the teachers. Jackie Pilati is bringing over 15 years of teaching experience in general and special education settings throughout New York City and Sonora, México. Jackie is an urban agriculturalist working on seed sovereignty and plant breeding projects to build climate and community resilience. She is passionate about working at the intersection of science education, technology, food justice, and culture. Kim Van Wyck has an M.A. in Education Policy from Teachers College, Columbia University and an M.A. in Teaching from Saint Mary's College of California. Kim was an educator in the Bay Area for eight years teaching both middle and elementary school. Her teaching philosophy was to foster culturally responsive learning environments designed to promote empathy and encourage civic participation. Kim believes strongly that a quality 21st century education must include digital literacy and equitable access to technology
