Scope of Work: Alternatives to Suspensions - Building Restorative Approaches

Project Overview

ISTE+ASCD will partner with Yonkers Public Schools to implement a comprehensive pilot program focused on developing effective alternatives to suspensions. This professional learning initiative will equip high school administrators and teachers with research-based, restorative approaches that reduce reliance on exclusionary discipline while fostering positive student behavior and academic achievement.

Program Objectives

- 1. Develop a comprehensive toolkit of suspension alternatives aligned with MTSS (Multi-Tiered System of Support)
- 2. Analyze current suspension patterns and identify intervention opportunities
- 3. Create a tiered menu of alternatives matched to specific behaviors
- 4. Implement restorative practices that maintain educational continuity
- 5. Establish protocols for monitoring effectiveness of implemented alternatives

Professional Learning Structure

Day 1: Effective Alternatives to Suspension within MTSS

- Audience: High School Administrators, Teachers, and Central Office Staff
- Focus: Building a comprehensive toolkit of suspension alternatives, including:
 - o Restorative conferencing techniques
 - Skill-building interventions
 - Structured reflection processes
 - Restitution practices
- Format: In-person professional learning session with practical simulation exercises
- **Duration:** Full day (6-7 hours)

Day 2: Data Review and Implementation Planning

- Audience: Central Office Staff, High School Administrators, and Teacher Leaders
- Focus:
 - Analyzing current suspension patterns



- o Identifying intervention opportunities
- o Developing a tiered menu of alternatives matched to specific behaviors
- Format: In-person professional learning session with collaborative action planning
- **Duration:** Full day (6-7 hours)

Virtual Support: 10 Hours

- **Purpose:** Supporting implementation, refining protocols, and analyzing effectiveness
- Format: Virtual coaching sessions (configuration to be determined based on need)
- Focus Areas:
 - Troubleshooting implementation challenges
 - Adapting alternatives to specific school contexts
 - Reviewing data and measuring effectiveness
 - Refining protocols based on early implementation feedback

Key Solutions to be Addressed

- 1. Multi-tiered menu of specific alternatives to suspension matched to behavior types
- 2. In-school restoration centers as alternatives to out-of-school suspensions
- 3. Effective behavior contracts with clear, measurable goals and monitoring systems
- 4. Skill-building interventions addressing root causes of behavior problems
- 5. Restorative conferencing protocols to repair harm while preserving educational continuity
- 6. Reflection processes promoting accountability and growth
- 7. Restitution opportunities connecting consequences meaningfully to behaviors
- 8. Peer mediation programs as alternatives to administrative discipline
- 9. Classroom-based de-escalation strategies preventing exclusionary responses
- 10. Community service learning as an instructive alternative to suspension
- 11. Data tracking systems to monitor effectiveness of alternatives
- 12. Communication protocols with families supporting alternatives to suspension

Timeline

This pilot program is scheduled to begin in May 2025, with specific dates to be coordinated between ISTE+ASCD and Yonkers Public Schools.



Deliverables

- 1. Two full-day in-person professional learning sessions
- 2. Ten hours of virtual coaching support
