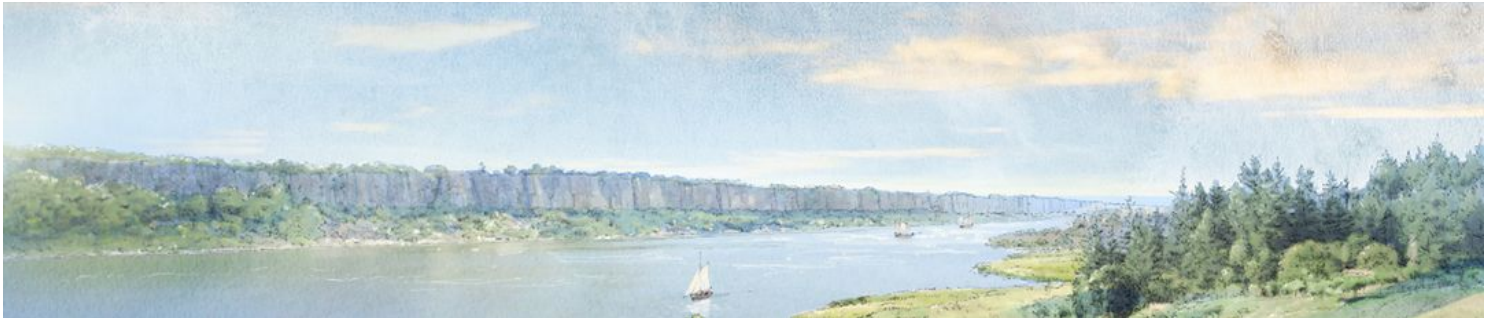

Student Field Trips

Philipse Manor Hall offers field trips for groups of all ages. Select an age range below to see program details.

Field trips are \$3/student. One chaperone per 10 students gets in free.

Grades 3-5

Philipse Manor Hall State Historic Site offers engaging field trips for students in grades 3-5 covering topics such as early exploration, daily life of the Munsee Lunaape, Dutch and English colonies, the fur trade, slavery and the slave trade, and the American Revolution.

Grades 6-8

Philipse Manor Hall State Historic Site offers engaging field trips for students in grades 6-8. Topics include international trade, including the slave trade, slavery in New York, the development of New Netherland and New York colonies, the manor system and tenant farmers, the fur trade and land agreements with the Munsee Lunaape, early colonial politics, and the American Revolution.

Grades 9-12

Topics include the development of the New Netherland and New York colonies, Dutch colonial culture including women's rights and their decline under British rule, enslavement and New York's role in the slave trade including the 1712 insurrection and 1741 Conspiracy and gradual emancipation, the Munsee Lunaape and land agreements (including Daniel Ninham), New York's manorial system and tenant uprisings, and the American Revolution, including divisions along rebel and Loyalist lines.
